

"NO MATTER WHAT you go through, you can find positive in it-if you're open to it." One may think this an unusual statement from someone diagnosed with a brain tumor eight months into her first pregnancy. But two years after delivering her daughter six weeks early, undergoing brain surgery, and regaining the ability to walk, talk, and see, Tina Chadwick knows it to be true.

In December 2008, Tina and her husband, Martin, launched Bee Well Wishes, an online retailer of feel-good, useful gifts such as T-shirts, lounge pants, onesies, pillowcases, and blankets, priced

between \$14 and \$56. During her own recovery, Tina received food she couldn't eat because of her feeding tube and flowers she couldn't keep because Martin was allergic. "The recipient [of Bee Well Wishes] will know the person who sent the gift understands what he or she is going through," she says, noting the loose-fitting clothes and wider neck holes for easy on/off access.
